We invite you to visit them and offer you the keys to enjoy the trip. In this brochure you will find a brief description of the Románico Palentino Nature Trail and the map for the journey, along with recommendations to make the most of this experience. We only ask one thing of you: do not forget to leave everything as you found it. The conservation of these pathways is also your responsibility.

This Románico Palentino Nature Trail uses an old path that linked the mining area of the Castillería, Vergaño and Orbó valleys with the Canal de Castilla, in Alar del Rey, through which coal used to arrive at Palencia and Valladolid.

This 103-km long nature trail consists of a main route of 66 kilometres, the “Ruta del Carbón de Cok” (Coke Coal Route), and two alternative routes that depart from the main one and complement it. The goal of these routes is to promote the rich Romanesque heritage of Palencia, one of the places with the largest concentration of this art style in Europe.


